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Severe and extreme inclement weather	Paddlers racing and safety crews on the water. Others in open areas (field and event steps leading to river)	Monitoring weather forecast.	Continue to monitor weather during event. Start of new course fishing season on 15/06/2024. Anglers fishing along length of race course, deploying fishing lines and hooks etc. coming into contact with paddlers racing, potential of injuries or capsizing. History of previous conflict between anglers and paddlers.	Racing paddlers, safety boat operators, all other on water users. Spectators along riverbank.	Club has contacted anglers informing them of the event taking place and requesting they do not fish during the event.	Warn racers at race briefings. Speak to any anglers fishing along the course during the race.	Race organiser or as delegated (must be a club official). Not to be undertaken alone!	Prior to event commencing (the morning of).


